RULES AND PROCEDURES

ALL SEMESTER 2 2009 ELECTIVES

- **School consent courses are unavailable to enrol online via myUNSW.** Application must submit to Faculty of Law Student Services and will be processed on first-come-first-serve basis. However, higher priority will be given to final year students, especially those completing degree requirements in **S2 2009**.
- You **must attach** a copy of your academic statement. Your academic statement can be printed from myUNSW.
- Applications close on **FRIDAY 15 MAY 2009**. You can submit your application at Faculty of Law Student Services Counter, fax to +61 2 9385 1774 or via email to law@unsw.edu.au.
- Students will be advised of the outcome of their application **via student email account** – no exception.
- All other **UG electives not listed in this form** will be available to enrol via myUNSW in May (exact date TBA)
- Students are permitted to enrol in a maximum of **27 UOC** in Semester 2 2009. Application for overload will be available in July.
- Census date for Teaching period two to withdraw from courses without academic and financial penalty:

PG ELECTIVES OPEN TO UG STUDENTS

Students must meet the following requirements to be eligible to apply for postgraduate electives:

- Students must have completed all or the majority of core law courses.
- Students must have credit average (65 WAM) or higher in either Graduate Law or Combined Degree programs.
- Students must have no recent recorded fail (within the last year of study).
- Students must meet course prerequisites and co-requisites.
- Overload is not permitted with PG electives enrolment
- The total number of PG electives shall not exceed half of your total law electives for the entire law program.

Transfer Students: The Law School understands that some transfer students may wish to accelerate their study, but is not able to give priority in allocating places until students are in their final year of study, and have completed all of the core law courses.

Number of Places offered: The school policy is to offer maximum 5 UG students in each PG elective to accord with UNSW policy. We will allocate your preferences base on completion of degree requirements and order of receipt.

Note: We reserve the right to cancel any PG courses under the circumstance of lack of enrolment.

K LC COURSES

- **Course Dates:** Commencing **Monday 20th of July** and ending **Friday 23 October**. Students do not attend the Centre for mid-semester break & reading week (Monday 7 September to Friday 18 September)
- **Requirements:** Intensive and Employment students are required to attend the Centre two full days a week (9am to 5pm) and non-intensive students attend one day a week. All students must attend a seminar from 4pm to 6pm every Wednesday as well as attending at 1 evening advice session throughout the session, from 5:30pm to 8.30pm, on either a Tuesday or Thursday evening. All students must attend a full day induction session on the first Monday of the session (**20 July**). This induction session includes a half day bus tour of the catchment area. If you don't attend the induction you cannot do the course. Students will receive a letter of offer by email from KLC shortly after applications close. This offer must be accepted immediately or your place may be offered to another student. Allocation of days of attendance at the Centre is completed by KLC within 2 weeks of your acceptance of a place in the course. While every effort is made to allocate students to their first preference of days, KLC is strictly limited to 10 students attending the Centre each day.
- **Students MUST attend all days. Requests to be absent from classes will not be considered.**
- **Prerequisites– LAWS6210 Law, Lawyers and Society, LAWS2311 Litigation 1**
- **Students who have completed any of the KLC courses in previous sessions are NOT eligible to apply for other KLC courses in Semester 2 2009.**
- **Students who are or will be enrolled in Social Justice Internship (LAWS2307) and Public Interest Internship (LAWS2308) in Semester 2 2009 are NOT eligible to apply for KLC courses in the same semester.**
- **Students will receive a letter of offer by email from KLC shortly after applications close.** This offer must be accepted immediately or your place may be offered to another student.
