The Master of Law & Management is a program of the Faculty of Law supported by the Australian School of Business AGSM MBA (Executive) program.

Who should enrol?

- Legal practitioners who have management responsibilities in a firm or are looking to move into management roles
- Lawyers dealing with corporations who need advanced legal knowledge and a solid understanding of the language and core concepts of management
- Practising managers in industry who want to broaden their management and legal expertise.



PROGRAM STRUCTURE

60 units of credit (uoc)

- Faculty of Law courses – minimum 4 courses (24 uoc)
- Management courses – 4 compulsory courses (24 uoc)
- Elective courses – 2 courses (12 uoc)

Students study a combination of law, taxation and management courses, to a total of 60 units of credit (uoc).

Students may enrol in the Master of Law & Management on a part time basis only (minimum of 5 semesters, maximum of 9 semesters).

Management courses

The management component of the degree is drawn from courses offered through the AGSM MBA (Executive) Program.

4 compulsory core management courses:

- MNGT6275 Managing People & Organisations
- MNGT6302 Economics in Management Practice
- MNGT6251 Marketing Management
- MNGT6321 Corporate Finance

Elective courses

The 2 elective courses can be chosen from either the Faculty of Law or the Management courses:
