**RULES AND PROCEDURES**

**GENERAL RULES**

1. The Internship Programs are available in both Session 1 and Session 2 each year. Details of the internship requirements and information about the participating Centres are provided in the brochure downloadable from the Law Faculty website and at the Law Faculty office.
2. **Eligibility:** Open to UNSW Bachelor of Laws students who have completed all, or the majority of the core courses. Priority will be given to students in their final or penultimate year. Specific pre-requisites may apply to a particular placement.
3. It is permissible to apply at the same time for both a Social Justice Internship and a Public Interest Internship but the respective Program coordinators confer with each other to ensure that no student is accepted by both Programs in the same or consecutive semesters.
4. Students are not permitted to undertake an internship during the semester in which they are enrolled in LAWS2303, LAWS2304 or LAWS2305 KLC Clinical Legal Education courses.
5. Participation is by competitive application. Students must apply by completing this form and submit via email to [LAWinternships@unsw.edu.au](mailto:LAWinternships@unsw.edu.au) by the closing date. Incomplete applications (ie. without transcript, resume, and statement) will not be processed. Late applications will not be accepted.
6. Students will be advised of the outcome of their application via their student email account **only** (ie z(SID@student.unsw.edu.au). It is student's responsibility to check their student email account regularly.

**SOCIAL JUSTICE INTERN PROGRAM (on UNSW campus)**

1. The Social Justice Intern Program is being conducted in 2009 by nine specialist Centres that are affiliated with UNSW and based on its Kensington campus. It provides students with an opportunity to work in centres which undertake action oriented research, networking and public advocacy.
2. Students will work under the supervision of the Director of the Centre to which they are allocated.
3. A list of the nine participating centres can be found in the Internship brochure.

**PUBLIC INTEREST INTERN PROGRAM (off UNSW campus)**

1. The Public Interest Internship Program affords students the opportunity to work in a 'public interest' Partner Organisation on aspects of policy and practice relating to any area of public interest law.
2. Students will work under the oversight of their Partner Organisation and a Law Faculty designated Academic Supervisor.
3. A sample list of Partner Organisations can be found in the Internship brochure. Students are encouraged to suggest organisations that may not be listed in the brochure. Placement at an organisation is based on the availability of the organisation to host the student, the number of students applying and any specific skill the organisation may require.
4. Students wishing to receive credit through the Aurora Internship Program will need to indicate this on their application form. Credit for internships will not be applied retrospectively.

**JOURNAL INTERN PROGRAM**

1. The Journal Intern Program affords students the opportunity of working for one of the journals affiliated with the Faculty.
2. Students will work under the supervision of an Editor or Editorial Board. One place is available each of Semester 1 and Semester 2 for the Australian Journal of Human Rights, Human Rights Defender and Australian Indigenous Law Reporter. One place is also available in the Summer Term for Australian Journal of Human Rights and for Human Rights Defender.
