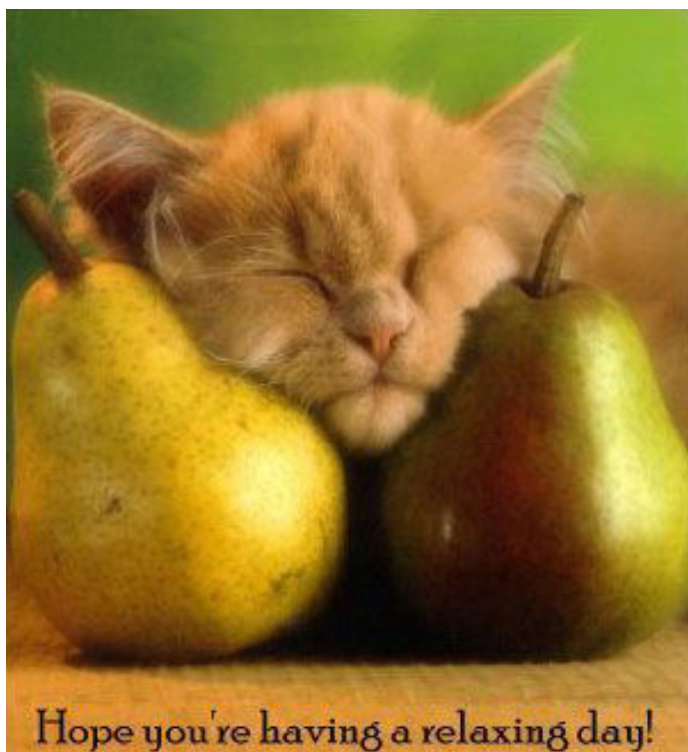

Success for UNSW Law Students at World Debating Championships

The UNSW Debating Society achieved fantastic results at the most recent World Intersvarsity Debating Championships hosted by Koc University in Turkey in 2010. It has been a terrific start for the year and the results are of particular significance for the Faculty.

Our top ranked UNSW team at the Worlds Intersvarsity Debating Championships was comprised of 2 law students studying at UNSW, including David Maher and Angela Kintominas. Our top team managed the fantastic feat of qualifying as one of the finalists, ahead of more than 400 teams in the competition. Both debaters are an excellent reflection of the standard of education at our law school as they debated complex legal and international issues such as "This House would criminally prosecute communities for complicity in honour killings", "This House would ban any scheme intended to 'cure' homosexuality", "This House would allow prisoners to raise their children behind bars" and "This House would prohibit high ranking members of the Sri Lankan military & the Tamil Tigers from participating in elections" etc.

The University of New South Wales was ranked 16th best in the world at the end of this competition. Furthermore, three of our speakers ranked in the top 100 debaters in the world.

The Worlds Intersvarsity Debating Championships attracts more than 1500 competitors and is one of the biggest annual international student events in the world. Our debaters were up against competitors from the University of Oxford, the University of Cambridge, Harvard University, Yale University and the London School of Economics.

UNSW Debsoc hosts Weekly Debating Evenings open to all law students at **Monday nights at 6pm** in Law101, Level 1 of the Law building, recommencing after the break.

Papers from all NSW undergraduate law students are sought for this competition run by the Australian Lawyers Alliance, with a focus on human rights and the rights of the individual.

There are 3 topics to choose from:

1. "In the United States, at present there is a debate concerning health care reform. President Obama has indicated that health care reform may include a consideration of tort reform. Do you consider that there is a link between health care reform and tort reform?" Discuss.
2. "The case of Dr Haneef confirms that it is important in a liberal democratic society to have a free press. Dr Haneef's case clearly demonstrates that a free press is of greater significance to the protection of the rights of individuals than a bill of rights. Do you agree?" Discuss.
3. "There has been considerable debate concerning mandatory sentencing and truth in sentencing. The benefit of mandatory sentencing is that the punishment of an offender is known and truth in sentencing creates reassurance in members of the public of criminal punishment. Do you agree?" Discuss.

The winner will receive:

Mooting Mayhem!

Mooting, one of the oldest (and greatest) traditions in Law School is returning for 2010 with a few new twists. The major change includes the creation of a 3 (rather than 4) leveled competition which will allow more students to compete in a fairer environment.

Beginners' Mooting

Intermediate Mooting

- The Intermediate Competition is the previous 'Junior' Competition.

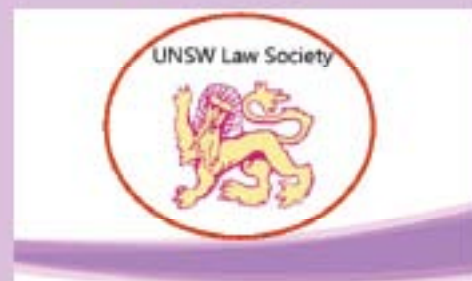

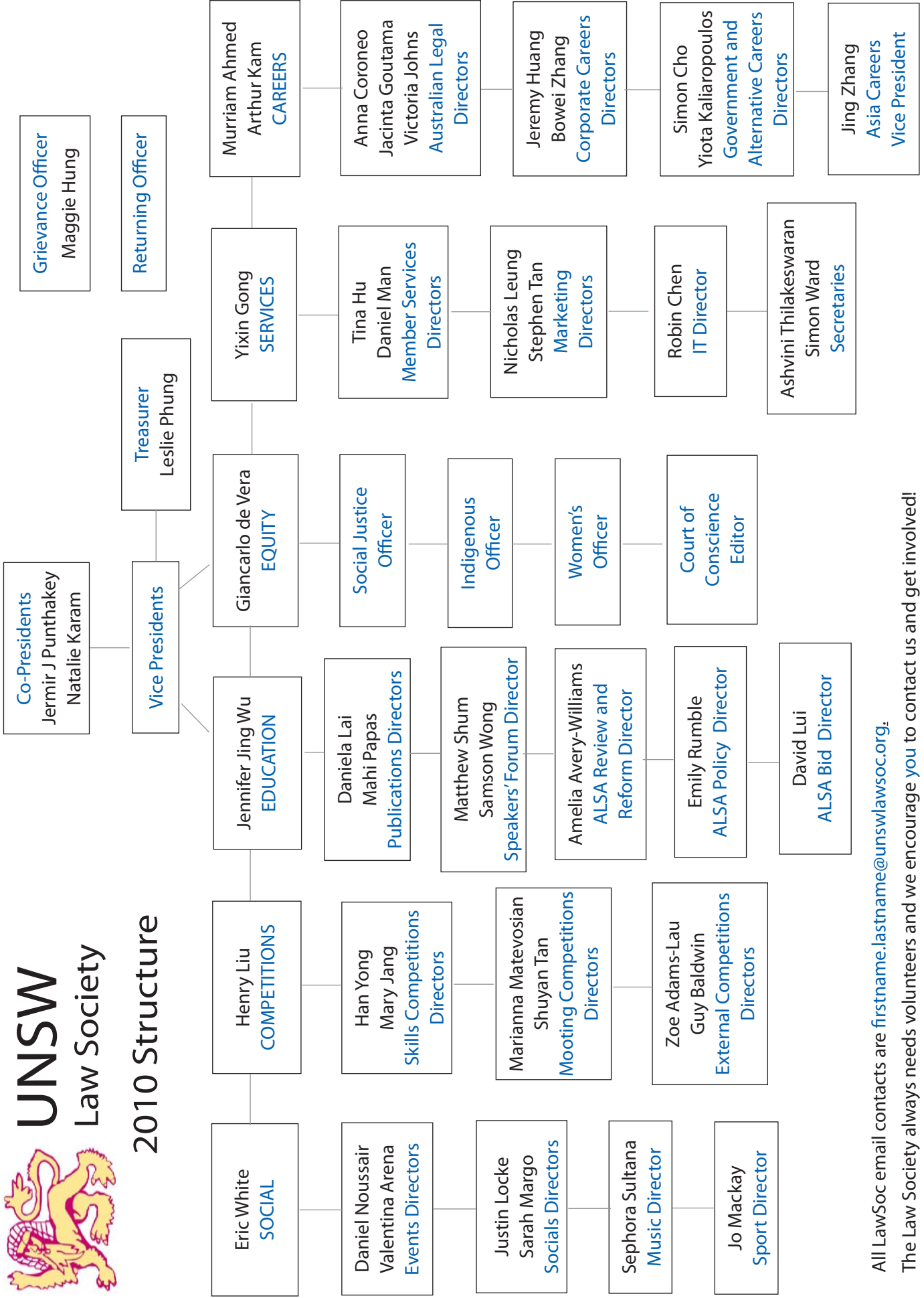
